# **Exhibition-Cum-Fair**

Kultali Milan Tirtha Society is a well-known Non-Govt. organisation in the area and has been engaged in welfare activities for the education, women's empowerment, science and technology, farmers' & fish farmers' development, social upliftment of the poor and destitute peoples of the Sundarban. Our organisation propagates the massively rich heterogeneous cultural heritage of West Bengal in Sundarban area. The Kultali Milan Tirtha Society has organized a ten day long Mega Exhibition-cum-Agriculture, Small Industry, Science and Technology, MSMEs and Cultural fair known as Sundarban Kristi Mela -O- Loko Sanskriti Utsab. The said exhibition has become 28th years old now. The said fair has gained recognition every year as one of the great and colourful fair through the participation of the Governments, both central and state and other private organizations together with notable N.G.Os.











Apart from the <u>Development Commissioner (Handicrafts)</u> sponsored Handicrafts Artisans and also participated of NJB, KVIC, TRIFED and DIC artisans; we got huge participation from several Ministries, Departments, Organizations, & PSUs of Government of India and Government of West Bengal and private Sectors also. The list of the participating departments/Organization so far as this year concerned is enclosed hereto.







The Exhibition-cum-Fair is purely educative with a view to disseminating information regarding nationwide development programmes to the people of Sundarbans, who are extremely backward and poor. Through this festival, we try to act so as to relieve the wide spread distress from their life and also they acquire different knowledge from different exhibits. More than six to seven lakh visitors have come in ten days from remote villages of the Sundarbans and also other region to visit and enjoy the recreational programmes. Our endeavor is to block and stop forced dropping of talents due to shortage of economic capability, of course according to our means and within our area of coverage.

The large varieties of items the Fair focused are as follows:- (1) Highlights of activities of Govt. Organization, (2) Educative Exhibition, (3) Discussions with constructive criticisms, (4) Workshop/Seminars, (5) Various Competitions (6) Blood Donation Camp etc (7) Free Eye Checkup Camp. (8) Free Mega Health Checkup Camp; (9) Apprenticeship Cum Job Mela; (10) Distribution of Seeds, RIR Chicks and feed to the SC/ST poor & destitute farmers; (11) Distribution of Fish fingerling and feeds to the SC women fish farmers.

#### Theme of our Event.

In this event our focus theme was "Highlighting The Rich Cultural Heritage of Developing India" and also our focus was Development of the Sundarbans Culture, Literacy, Health, Science and Technology, Improvement of Agriculture, Improvement of MSME, Handicrafts and Textiles Sectors, Peace, Harmony and self-reliance. A bunch of MSME units, Artisans, Farmers, Industrialists, Entrepreneurs, Traders, Buyers, Academicians, Scholars, Scientists, Government Officials, dignitaries, students and youths participated & visited and purchased their needs regularly in this Mega Event, various Govt. Minorities, Departments, Organizations & PSUs shared their valuable opinions on various aspects of the development of our country by showcasing and demonstrating through different latest developments and the achievements which benefited a lot of Entrepreneurs, Industrialists, MSME Units, weavers, Farmers, General people, students were visible in the fair from different areas of the society as well as from Bengal, who acquired knowledge about recent development of India. It was an ideal platform for the interaction among the Exhibitors, Buyers-Sellers, and beneficiaries under a single roof which is rare event of the country. The MSME units, Handicrafts Artisans and SHGs who participated in the fair sold a huge quantity of goods.

# Particulars of the Event \_\_\_\_\_

In the programme in collaboration with ICAR-CIFRI 500 scheduled caste women fish farmers were provided fish fingerlings (6 kg. each) and Fish feed (60 kgs each) and with the collaboration of ICAR-NBFGR, Lucknow of 50 scheduled caste fish farmers were provided fingerlings of indigenous Singhi fish in Sundarbans region, for promotion of fisheries and to strengthen their livelihood and the Chief Guest highlighted the contribution of the institute in the field of fisheries and Indian fisheries and informed about various schemes of the government and to double the income of fish farmers. We organize observance of National Farmers day and distribution of Agricultural Inputs (Seeds, Paddy seeds, Spray unit, RIR Chicks, Vermicomposed bed etc.) for 3000 bonafied farmers, in Sundarbans in collaboration with CRIJAF, Barrackpore.

The subjects of seminars organized by the Mela committee on different days include the Seminar on Jal Jeevan Mission & Mission Life; Seminar on National Unity, Workshop on Genetic Fish Farming Development in collaboration with ICAR-National Bureau of Fish Genetic Resources, Workshop on Health Hygiene, Workshop on Transparency and ban on single use plastic. Workshop on Swachhata Mein Jan Bhagidari, Seminar on Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampad Yojona, Workshop on Global Warming, Awareness Camp on LPG connection, Quiz competition & Prize distribution, Competition on Recitation, Folk Dance, Songs, Sit & Draw involving children of different age groups with total participants of about 450 Mothers & young competitors in Sundarban area. This year we arrange AADHAR SEVA CAMP at our exhibition ground.

More than 6 - 7 lacs of people assembled on the exhibition ground and they became spell bound having witnessed various performances. The exhibition this year has been crowned with covetous recognition as the greatest rural fair in West Bengal. The Exhibition-cum-Fair had been divided into mainly four zones, those were- (1) Education & Culture Park, (2) Amusement Park, (3) Buying & Selling Park and (4) Food Park.

(1) Education & Culture Park: In this very zone various types of educational and cultural exhibitions had been shown through various Central, State Govt. & Non-Govt. pavilions/stalls and at the same time the main stage of the fair was placed in this zone. ITI College 4. 22 numbers Junior High School at Basanti Block; The Sundarbanans have to pay free of cost (LPG) connections under riverbeds to prevent the destruction of Mangrove previous year, we made this demand. 
